

Invitation to Confession

Priest: On this celebration of All Saints, we ask ourselves:

What is our idea of saints?

Are they to us idealistic dreamers

out of touch with the world and with people, passive and joyless like their plaster statues

or image depictions?

Today's liturgy tells us a different story.

They are ordinary people like us,

of the same flesh and blood as we are.

But they had the courage to be different,

to do the ordinary things of life

in the extraordinary way of Christ

from whom they drew their courage.

Their lives often lived with their quiet

but strong gentleness, their integrity, their commitment

to God and to people in justice, truth, and peace.

As we confess our sin, let us ask our merciful God for the strength to follow him the way they did.

Silence is kept.

have mercy upon you,

pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,

and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: and peace to God's people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly king, almighty God and Father,

we worship you, we give you thanks,

we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

Eucharistic Prayer

[The Book of Alternative Prayer, The Anglican Church of Canada, 1985. Eucharistic Prayer 3]

Priest: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Priest: Blessed are you, gracious God,

creator of heaven and earth; in the multitude of your saints

you have surrounded us

with so great a cloud of witnesses, that we, rejoicing in their fellowship,

may run with patience the race that is set before us, and together with them receive the crown of glory

that never fades away.

Therefore with angels and archangels

and with all who have served you in every age,

we raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

Congregation may sit or kneel at this time.

Priest: We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son.

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Father, according to his command,

All: we remember his death,

we proclaim his resurrection,

we await his coming in glory;

and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.
