*Pre-Authorized Remittance Program (PAR) – A number of people noted on their givings cards that they would like to increase their PAR or start using PAR. To make a change or start using PAR, please send an e-mail to St. Luke's Givings e-mail (givings@stluke cedarhill.ca) and include the following information as noted. To make a change to PAR, include your envelope #, the date you would like the change to happen (eg January 1, 2025 or February 1, 2025, etc.), and the amount of the change. The PAR comes out of one's account on the 20th of the month but changes have to be sent in prior to the 10th of the month.
