Tonight, as we remember the mother Mary rocking her baby, we pray for all children born this Christmas season... Watch over mothers and fathers and grandparents, hoping for the best for their newborns... Help us create communities where every child is valued and every family has enough ... May families rejoice because Christ the Saviour is born for each of us and for all of us.

Brief silence...

Eternal God, God with us,

All: Hear us, we pray.

Tonight, as we remember the father Joseph protecting his little one, we pray for all those watching over the helpless and the hopeless... Be with all those who must work tonight to keep the world safe and to care for those in need... Be with those who are sick or sad or lonely, so each one will know your comforting presence...

Brief silence...

Eternal God, God with us,

All: Hear us, we pray.

God of the starry heavens and the good old earth, tonight as we remember the shepherds coming in haste and wonder, open our hearts to reach out to the Christ Child, to receive the gift you offer us in him, even as we offer our love to you in his name. Bless us in the year ahead, so we can share your love with all the lives that touch ours.

Priest: The Lord be with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Priest: All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere, mighty creator, ever-living God.

We give you thanks and praise for your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ,
who for love of our fallen race humbled himself, and on this night was born of the Virgin Mary by the power of your Spirit, and lived as one of us.
In this mystery of the Word made flesh you have caused his light to shine in our hearts, to give knowledge of your glory in the face of Jesus Christ.
In him we see our God made visible and so are caught up in the love of the God

Congregation may sit or kneel at this time.

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

Drink this, all of you, this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

The Giving of Communion

Priest: The table of bread and wine is now ready.
It is the table of company with Jesus,

It is the table of communion with the earth, in which Christ became incarnate. So come to this table, you who have much faith and you who would like to have more; you who have been here often and you who have not been for a while; you who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have failed; Come.

It is Christ who invites us to meet him here.

All: Thanks be to God.

Please follow the directions of the sidespeople as the congregation is invited to come forward to receive the bread and wine.

If you would prefer not to receive communion, please come forward for a blessing. Crossing your hands over your chest will signal the priest to give you a blessing instead.

Please remain seated as we sing the hymns during communion.
