**Sacrament** – "An outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace;" two are Gospel sacraments (baptism and eucharist) and many hold that there are seven - the chief two plus confirmation, penance (confession and absolution), matrimony, ordination and unction (anointing of the sick).

**Seasons of the Church Year** – Liturgical calendar: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost/Trinity. Seasons are often distinguished by changes of colour of vestments and church decorations.

**Stewardship** – Use of time, talent and treasure in responsible ways for the sake of the world.

**Waterloo Declaration** – An agreement establishing full communion between the Anglican Church of Canada and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, entered into in Waterloo, Ontario in July 2001. It provides, among other things, for the interchangeability of ordained ministry between the two churches. The Joint Anglican Lutheran Commission (JALC) oversees the implementation of the agreement.
